We have **author and speaker James Perloff** as a featured speaker! Other returning instructors / mentors so far, include Mr. Peik, Mr. Shurtleff, Mr. Hoderny, Mr. “V,” and me. As usual, **Mr. Shurtleff** will lead the **Community Outreach** session. Did I hear someone say **“Ice cream!”**?

Now a tradition – Family Camp is growing each year as we incorporate Junior Campers and mini-campers into a great family vacation! We welcome families with younger children, or no children, plus grandparents, and others (See worksheet for accommodations.) We always have a **wonderful group of young people** and it's good to see them **interacting so well with the little ones**, with **each other**, with the **grown ups**, and even with us *ancient* ones!

Of course there's the historical field trip down to the sites where freedom's battles were fought in America! **Your friends are probably coming, and they'll want to see you, too!** We're looking forward to reading **your articles and poems** in the camp paper and seeing more of **your artwork in the cabins and newspaper!**

## **Calculate your costs Using Attached Worksheet:**

Regular Campers (Students age 12-20 staying in “cabins”)..... \$299 / camper

Adult Assistant: Editor, Counselor, Teacher, Lifeguard, Nurse..... \$200 / staffer

### **Family Rooming Together:**

Non-staff adult in family (Regular Price Lodging & Meals = \$340); our cost \$299

Adult staff member ..... \$200

Children 3-11 w / adults (Reg. Price for 6 nights, 17 meals each=138); cost \$125

Children under 3, FREE with 1 or 2 adults\* ..... (0)

\*(Preferably 2, especially *if one has counselor or other major assignments*)

EXAMPLE: One-week FAMILY VACATION - lodging 6 nights, and all 17 meals:

{1 Adult @ 299 + 1 Staffer @ 200; any under 3 @0; + 2 under12@125} = 749 /week.

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### **Family group** (including responsible adult) may opt for **Tent / RV camping:**

On a limited basis, Family Tent / RV may be set up for \$15.00 / day or \$90 / week.

Meal charges: \$120/week each (12 years or older); \$90/week each (ages 3 thru 11 years).

EXAMPLE: (\$90 / week campsite) + (Meals 2 adults; 1 under 3; + 2 under 12= \$420)

**One week for this family of 5 for \$510, including classes / activities in camp!**

(Additional charges for travel, admissions, on certain field trips)

## **SINCE MY CHILD IS GOING TO CAMP, WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?**

We have a range of camp activities plus two field trips planned. During recreation time, our head counselor is usually down at the lake, so students may swim or use camp watercraft, or simply choose to enjoy the beauty, sketch, write, or observe local plant or animal life. Meanwhile, our recreation director and other counselors will organize team sports, chess tournaments, tug-o-war or other camp experiences.

Classes taught by experienced guest speakers cover many historical and timely topics to give teens a better perspective on world events in context of our nation's founding. Today we are reaping the consequences of America's drift from original moorings. Our discussions of America's founding and early success are very much in order as we seek to restore blessings of liberty to our land under our Constitution.

## **SPENDING MONEY for CAMPER USE**

While meals, lodging, classroom materials and most recreational costs are covered by the tuition fee, we recommend that regular campers bring at least \$40.00 to give them the option to purchase things such as a camp group photo, special admissions on certain field trips, souvenirs from historical sites, postcards, etc., or more for books, DVDs, or T-shirts from the book table, snack items from time to time, and pizza to enjoy after graduation ceremonies and campfire activities on the final night.

**CHECK-IN:** Camp Check-in begins the first day of camp from 2:00 – 5:30 PM at Toah Nipi 252 Old Ashburnham Road, s. off Rte.119 east of Rindge.

**CHECK-OUT:** The last day of camp from 10:00 – 11:00 AM.

**MEDICATIONS:** Camp has a doctor or nurse on duty through the week. Any meds needed for a camper must be given to and discussed with doctor/nurse at check-in.

## **CAMP WEAR:**

Dress code is strictly enforced. If Camp Director / Counselors determine that something is inappropriate, camper will be asked to change. Continued infraction could result in expulsion from camp.

### **Allowed:**

- Shorts (but nothing that comes above mid-thigh)
  - Jeans, khakis, running pants, and other athletic apparel
  - T-shirts, polo shirts, tank tops (females: NO low-cut tops)
  - Modest Swimwear (ladies, one-piece or tankini; gentlemen: boxer-style)
- If there is any doubt about acceptability of swimwear, **bring alternative!**

**Not Allowed:** Clothing with inappropriate or suggestive messages, or referencing drugs/alcohol/rock bands/profanity; No bikinis, spandex, or speedo-style swimwear.

**WHAT TO BRING** (*Laundry facilities NOT available*) Appropriate clothing to last a week:

- Dress Apparel and Shoes for Friday banquet / graduation
  - Ladies: Dress, (or) Skirt or Dress Pants with blouse
  - Gentlemen: Dress Pants with collared shirt and a tie
- Shorts (but nothing that comes above mid-thigh)
- Polo Shirts, T-Shirts, Tank Tops (females: NO low-cut tops)
- Sweatshirt(s) / Hoodies
- Long pants / Jeans
- Pajamas;  Socks and Underwear
- Water-Resistant Jacket
- Swimwear (Modest!) If in doubt, bring an alternative!
- Beach Towel / Bath Towel(s)
- Flip-Flops / Water Shoes;  Sturdy pair of sneakers / shoes that can get dirty!
- Toiletry items (soap, shampoo, toothbrush & paste, deodorant, ...)
- Sunscreen and bug repellent
- Sleeping bag or twin-size bedding, AND  Pillow!
- NOTEBOOK & PEN (or pencils); ( optional – sketchbook )
- Flashlight and extra batteries (Trail down to the lake for campfire is dark!)
- Musical instrument, items for skit or hobby demo at campfire, sketchbook, pens?
- Art supplies, streamers, balloons, patriotic images, drawing paper for the cabin-decorating contest – *it's cool to be creative!*
- Recreational sports equipment / board games or cards
- Camera, with any batteries, memory stick, or film you might need
- Spending money for camp group photo; T-shirts, books & DVDs at literature table; souvenirs, postcards, snacks; Friday night pizza (unless your cabin wins cabin decorating contest!); etc. **New suggested minimum = \$40.00**

**WHAT NOT TO BRING:** (If cell phones are brought, they will need to be turned in to cabin counselor / parent, and only used with permission.)

No firearms, noisemakers, fireworks, radios, CD players, iPods, MP3 players, etc. If your alarm clock has a radio function you may NOT use that as the alarm. No tobacco products of any kind. No alcohol and no non-prescription drugs of any kind. No immodest clothing (nothing promoting rock music themes/band, or having any wording or phrases with profanity, sexually suggestive meanings or connotations). No body piercing. Inappropriate tattoos must be covered.
